CURRICULUM POLICY

We offer all learners the opportunity to access a broad and balanced curriculum that fulfils the requirements of the national curriculum across Key Stages 3, 4 and 5. The curriculum is tailored to meet the particular needs of our learners within the context of the community which we serve and the prior attainment of our learners.

The core of our curriculum at KS3 and 4 includes English, Maths, Science, Religious Education, Personal Social Citizenship & Health Education, ICT and 2 hours of Physical Education. At KS3 all pupils also study a modern foreign language, history, geography, technology (including design and food), music, art and drama.

Our school offers a choice of educational routes at Key stage 4 and 5 and we carefully support our learners in making informed choices regarding their options. Our guidance programme includes personal interviews, consultation with parents and is closely linked to our monitoring and assessment programme. All learners have equality of access to the full range of learning opportunities.

In order to support learning, we operate a learning support base for Key Stage 3 pupils who have specific difficulty accessing mainstream education, at Key stage 4 students with specific needs are catered for within an Alternative curriculum base. In both of these facilities learners are supported in a variety of ways in order that they re-engage in learning accessing the full curriculum wherever possible.

We aim to provide specialist teaching throughout the curriculum and the curriculum is constantly under review, adapting to the specific needs of the learners in each cohort.
